The net income of the Fund and its assets and liabilities, net of consolidation adjustments, is included in the consolidated financial statements of the Ministry of Treasury Board and Finance and the Government of Alberta.
 The Access to the Future Act allows for a maximum of §3 billion to be transferred into the Fund to support the advanced education endowment.
 In accordance with section 8(2) of the Alberta Hertage Servings Truet Fund Act, the net income of the Fund, less any amount retained in the Fund to maintain its value from inflation, shall be transferred to the GHz and the Alberta Hertage Servings Truet Fund Act, the net income of the Fund, less any amount retained in the Fund to maintain its value from inflation, shall be transferred to the GHz annualty in a manner determined by the Minister of Finance.

 March 31, 1996 marked the end of the old structure of the Hertage Fund. In 1986-97, the Fund commenced a structuring process under a new framework. The new framework provided for a transform into more market based investments; inflation proofing the Fund and a long-turnin proofing the rest and allows for the greatest financial returns on meetments.










### Own-source revenue excluding resources % of GDP -- 2016 Source: CANSIM 385-0041 and 384-0048
